Whereas the Government of Goa is of the opinion that an industrial dispute exists between the management of M/s. Hotel Cidade de Goa, Unit of Fomento Hotel & Resort, Vainguinim, Dona Paula, Goa and it's workmen represented by Cidade de Goa Hotel Employees Union in respect of the matter specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the "said dispute");

And whereas the Government of Goa considers it expedient to refer the said dispute for adjudication.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (Central Act 14 of 1947) (hereinafter referred to as the "said Act"), the Government of Goa hereby refers the said dispute for adjudication to the Industrial Tribunal of Goa, at Panaji-Goa, constituted under Section 7-A of the said Act.

SCHEDULE

"(1) Whether the Charter of Demands dated 21-01-2008 served by the Cidade de Goa Hotel Employees' Union Dona Paula on the management of M/s. Cidade de Goa, Unit of Fomento Hotel and Resort, Vainguinim, Dona Paula, Goa are legal and justified?"

CHARTER OF DEMANDS

(1) Demand No. 1: Pay Scales

It is demanded that all the workmen should be given pay scale as follows:

(2) Demand No. 2: Flat Rise

It is demanded that all the workmen should be given a flat rise at the rate mentioned below:

Grade (I, II, III and IV)	: Rs: 1,000/-
Grade (V, VI, VII, VIII and IX)	: Rs. 1,100/-

(3) Demand No. 3: Seniority Increment

It is demanded that the workmen should be given Seniority Increments as mentioned below:

Service upto 2 years	: One Increment
Service above 2 years and upto 4 years	: Two Increments
Service above 4 years and upto 8 years	: Three Increments
Service above 8 years and upto 13 years	: Four Increments
Service above 13 years and upto 18 years	: Five Increments
Service above 18 years and upto 25 years	: Six Increments
Service above 25 years	: Seven Increments

(4) Demand No. 4: Fixed Dearness Allowance (FDA)

It is demanded that an amount of Rs. 750/- should be added to the existing Fixed Dearness Allowance as the Fixed Dearness Allowance presently paid is very less.

(5) Demand No. 5: Variable Dearness Allowance

It is demanded that the Variable Dearness Allowance should be paid at the revised rate of Rs. 3/- per point and rise above 2000 points (1960=100) Further, it is demanded that the computation of Variable Dearness Allowance should be made quarterly based on the average rise of points for the preceding quarter.

(6) Demand No. 6: House Rent Allowance

It is demanded that House Rent Allowance should be paid at the revised rate of 30% of basic and dearness allowance, as the cost of accommodation is very high in Goa, it being a Tourist State.

(7) Demand No. 7: Children Education Allowance

It is demanded that all workmen should be paid a Children Education Allowance at the rate of Rs. 500/- per month.

(8) Demand No. 8: Conveyance Allowance

It is demanded that all workmen should be paid Conveyance Allowance at the rate of Rs. 500/- per month.

(9) Demand No. 9: Transport Facility

It is demanded that free transport facility should be provided to those workmen who are presently not provided with this facility.

(10) Demand No. 10: Paid Holidays

It is demanded that all the festival holidays that fall on weekly off day should be changed to next day or one day earlier, which should be finalized in consultation with the Union.

(11) Demand No. 11: Leave

It is demanded that all the leave which was reduced in the last wage settlement should be resorted, as great hardship is cause to the workers and therefore, workers should be given back the leave as under:

- (a) Earned Leave of 30 days per year.
- (b) Causal Leave of 10 days per year.
- (b) Sick Leave of 12 days per year.

(12) Demand No. 12: Leave Travel Allowance

It is demanded that Leave Travel Allowance should be paid at the revised rate of Rs. 5,000/- per annum, with minimum of four days earned leave. The amount shall be paid one week before the commencement of leave.

(13) Demand No. 13: Medical Reimbursement/ Medical Allowance

It is demanded that those workmen outside the purview of Employees State Insurance Corporation should be reimbursed full medical expenses and to meet the expenses of their families they should be granted and amount of Rs. 6,000/ per year as medical allowances.

(14) Demand No. 14: Loan

It is demanded that interest free loan of Rs. 50,000/- should be granted for house repair and construction of House.

(15) Demand No. 15: Canteen Subsidy

It is demanded that all the workmen should be paid canteen subsidy at the rate of Rs. 500/- per month.

(16) Demand No. 16: Festival Advance

It is demanded that all the workmen should be granted festival allowance at Rs. 3,500/- once in a year to meet the additional expenses incurred by him for such festival and the same shall be recovered in 10 equal installments.

(17) Demand No. 17: Employment Next to Kin

It is demanded that the kin of the workmen who died or retired should be given employment.

(18) Demand No. 18: Bonus/Ex-gratia

It is demanded that all the workmen should be paid Bonus/Ex-gratia at the rate of 20% of gross wages every year, before Diwali.

(19) Demand No. 19: Upgradation

It is demanded that those employees who could not get higher grade should be upgraded as and when they completed 5 years in same grade.

(20) Demand No. 20: Break Shift Allowance

It is demanded that all the workmen who are working in break shift should be paid break shift allowance at the rate of Rs. 300/- per month.

(21) Demand No. 21: Period of Settlement

It is demanded that the period of the settlement should be three years from the date of expiry of the last settlement.

(22) Demand No. 22: Retirement Age

It is demanded that the retirement age of the workers should be fixed as 60 years.

(23) Demand No. 23: Confirmation of Services of those workers who have worked for more than six months

It is demanded that those workmen who have worked for more than six months should be made permanent and should be extended the benefits of the settlement.

(2) If answer to above issue No. (1) is in the negative, then, what relief the workmen are entitled to?"

Vision Limited and it's workmen represented by the Goa Trade and Commercial Workers Union, in respect of the matter specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the "said dispute");

And whereas the Government of Goa considers it expedient to refer the said dispute for adjudication.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (Central Act 14 of 1947) (hereinafter referred to as the "said Act"), the Government of Goa hereby refers the said dispute for adjudication to the Industrial Tribunal of Goa at Panaji-Goa, constituted under Section 7-A of the said Act.

SCHEDULE

"(1) Whether the following demands raised by the Goa Trade & Commercial Workers Union (AITUC), Panaji-Goa, vide letter dated 14-06-2007, before the management of M/s. G.K.B. Vision Limited, Pilerne Industrial Estate, Pilerne-Goa are legal and justified?"

Demand No. 1: Appointment/Confirmation letters

It is demanded to issue Appointment/Confirmation letters by the management to all the unionized workpersons who are not issued Appointment letters, mentioning their correct date of joining with designation.

Demand No. 2: Flat-Rise in Basic and Pay Scales

(a) It is demanded that all the workpersons shall be paid a flat rise at the rate of Rs. 1,100/- per month over and above the existing basic salary as on 14-06-2006 plus a flat rise of Rs. 1,100/- per month be placed in the pay scales given hereinbelow:

B	Jr. Operator	800-85-1225-100-1725-115-2300-130-2950.
C	Operator	900-100-1400-115-1975-130-2625-145-3350.

(b) The Annual Increment shall be in the month of January every year. Employees reaching the ceiling of the scale in the respective grades will receive increment last drawn by them in the applicable scale.

Demand No. 3: House Rent Allowance (HRA)

It is demanded that, with effect from 15-06-2007, each workperson shall be paid an additional amount of Rs. 600/- per month in his existing House Rent Allowance (HRA).

Demand No. 4: Fixed Dearness Allowance (FDA)

It is demanded, that with effect from 15-06-2007, each workperson shall be paid an amount of Rs. 800/- per month as the Fixed Dearness Allowance over and above the existing Fixed Dearness Allowance (FDA), if any.

Demand No. 5: Variable Dearness Allowance (VDA)

It is demanded that, with effect from 15-06-2007, each workperson shall be paid a Variable Dearness Allowance (VDA) at the rate of Rs. 2/- per point over and above base AAICPI 1722 points (1960=100). The Variable Dearness Allowance (VDA) shall be revised every quarter.

Demand No. 6: Conveyance Allowance

It is demanded, that each workperson shall be paid Conveyance Allowance of Rs. 450/- per month in their existing Travelling Allowance with effect from 15-06-2007.

Demand No. 7: City Compensation Allowance

It is demanded that, with effect from 15-06-2007, each workperson shall be paid a sum of Rs. 400/- per month towards City Compensation Allowance.

Demand No. 8: Shift Allowance

It is demanded that, with effect from 15-06-2007, each workperson shall be paid a Shift Allowance on the following basis:

1st Shift Allowance	...	Rs. 15/- per shift
2nd Shift Allowance	...	Rs. 25/- per shift
3rd Shift Allowance	...	Rs. 35/- per shift

Demand No. 9: Out Door Food Allowance

It is demanded that whenever a workman is sent out-duty, he/she shall be paid an out-door

Food Allowance towards breakfast, lunch, dinner, tea and snacks on the following pattern:

Break fast	...	Rs. 35/- per day
Lunch	...	Rs. 65/- per day
Dinner	...	Rs. 65/- per day
Tea and Snacks	...	Rs. 25/- per day

Demand No. 10: Leave Travel Allowance

It is demanded that, with effect from 15-06-2007, each workperson shall be paid Leave Travel Allowance (LTA) on the following basis:

Grade-B	...	Rs. 4,500/-
Grade-C	...	Rs. 5,500/-
Grade-D	...	Rs. 6,500/-
Grade-E	...	Rs. 7,500/-

Demand No. 11: Overtime

- (a) It is demanded that each workperson shall be paid Overtime at double the rate of wages with retrospective effect. Whenever a worker is required to work on Sundays/Holidays and Weekly Off days, he shall be paid double the rate of wages with a paid compensatory-off which shall be allowed to be availed by the worker within 3 days of such work.
- (b) It is demanded that when a workman of a first shift is asked to wait for the overtime for the 2nd shift, he be provided overtime as mentioned above and company shall provide a vehicle to drop the employee at home or pay actual Transport Allowance.
- (c) It is demanded that, with effect from 15-06-2007, whenever an employee is required to work on overtime for continuous 12 hours of duty, he/she shall be paid Food Allowance of Rs. 40/- per extra shift worked.

Demand No. 12: Leave Facilities

It is demanded that the workperson shall be eligible to the following leave facilities with effect from 15-06-2007.

- a) Privilege Leave : 23 days per annum within a facility to accumulate upto 100 days and encash leave above 50 days.
- b) Causal Leave : 9 days per annum with a facility to accumulate upto 30 days or with a facility to encash the balance leave.

- c) Sick Leave : 10 days per annum with a facility to accumulate upto 30 days.
- d) Holidays : 14 days per annum to be finalized in the month of January every year between the Union and the Management.

Demand No. 13: Canteen

It is demanded that the company shall have a full fledged subsidized canteen for all the workpersons with following facilities:

- (a) Snacks shall be provided with morning and evening tea.
- (b) Fish curry rice shall be provided at fully subsidized rate.
- (c) Twice in a week canteen shall provide Chicken/Rice at fully subsidized rate.
- (d) A television shall be provided in the cafeteria.
- (e) Tables and chairs shall be provided to accommodate 100 employees.
- (f) The 'Canteen' menu shall be discussed with the Union/workmen.

Demand No. 14: Rest Room

It is demanded that the well furnished fully equipped Rest-Room shall be provided at the factory with immediate effect since the workers are working in 3-shift operation and workmen employed in factory are more than 100.

Demand No. 15: Bonus

It is demanded that 20% Bonus shall be paid to every employee on gross wages (Basic+DA+VDA+HRA+TA+OT+EDU. ALLOW+MISC. ALLOW+SHIFT ALLLOW) etc. without any ceiling. Annual bonus is to be disbursed eight days before the Ganesh Chaturthi.

Demand No. 16: Maternity Leave

It is demanded that, in addition to the entitlement of Maternity Leave and the Maternity Benefits stipulate under the Employees' State Insurance Act, 1948 (39 of 1948), the Company shall allow 2 months of additional paid leave to all eligible women.

Demand No. 17: Uniforms/Washing Allowance/Safety Shoes/Gum Boots/Raincoats/Towel

It is demanded that each workperson shall be provided with the following facilities:

- (a) *Uniforms:*
That, with effect from 15-06-2007, each workperson shall be issued 2 sets of Uniforms every year in the month of January.
- (b) *Washing Allowance:*
That, with effect from 15-06-2007, each workperson shall be paid a sum of Rs. 250/- per month towards Washing Allowance.
- (c) *Safety Shoes/Gum Boots:*
Each workperson shall be given one pair of slippers, shoes/footwear to be distributed in the month of January every year and a pair of gum boots/rain sandals in the month of May i.e. last week of may every year.
- (d) *Towels:*
Each workperson shall be issued two towels for each year and two soaps of 100 gms. (Lifebuoy) each month.

Demand No. 18: Transfer

It is demanded that GKB Vision Workers Managing Committee Members shall be treated as 'Protected Workmen' in terms of Rule 16 of the Industrial Dispute (Central) Rules, 1957, and the existing service conditions of these workmen shall remain unchanged.

Demand No. 19: Insurance

24 hours Group Personnel Accident Insurance Scheme.

It is demanded that each worker shall be covered for all the 24 hours for accidents or death for a sum of Rs. 2.00 lakhs under the Group Personnel Accident/Insurance Scheme.

Demand No. 20: Medical Check-up

It is demanded that all the employees shall be provided with free medical check-up once in a year.

Demand No. 21: Death Relief Scheme

- (1) It is demanded that if an employee dies during the normal course of employment, such employee shall be paid a sum of Rs. 1,50,000/- from the management to his family (legal heirs). This payment shall not have any bearing on the workmen's right to claim under the workmen's Compensation Act, 1923 (8 of 1923).
- (2) It is demanded that the Company shall pay a sum of Rs. 12,000/- towards funeral expenses.

Demand No. 22: Festival Advance

It is demanded that each workperson shall be paid Rs. 4,000/- as festival advance to be deducted

in 8 equal installments, at least 10 days prior to the following festival every year:

- (a) Ganesh Chaturthi festival.
- (b) Christmas festival.

Demand No. 23: X'Mas Gift/Diwali Gift

It is demanded that each workperson shall be presented with a X'Mas or Diwali Gift every year costing not less than Rs. 1,500/-.

Demand No. 24: Sanction of Leave

It is demanded that whenever a workperson applies for leave the intimation regarding sanctioning of leave shall be made known to the concerned workmen within 6 hours of such application being made by an employee seeking leave.

Demand No. 25: Annual Picnic

It is demanded that the Company shall finalize one day for annual picnic and relieve all the workmen for picnic and further it shall provide free food, free transport and beverage for attending the picnic in any part of Goa.

Demand No. 26: Union Office

It is demanded that a separate union office shall be provided to all the union office bearers with tables, chairs, fans and telephone facility.

Demand No. 27: Home drop for working in 2nd and 3rd Shift

It is demanded that all employees shall be provided with home drops after 7.00 p.m. and those working in 2nd and 3rd shift operations.

Demand No. 28: Marriage Special Privilege

It is demanded that every employee who gets married shall be granted 7 days paid leave.

Demand No. 29: period of Settlement

It is demanded that the above Demands dated 14-06-2007 are specifically for the period of 3 years effective from 15-06-2007 to 14-06-2010.

AWARD

(Passed on this 2nd day of June, 2009)

By order dated 23-11-2004, the Government of Goa, in exercise of powers conferred by clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, has referred the following dispute to this Tribunal for adjudication.

“(1) Whether the action of the management of M/s. Haathi Mahal Resort Hotel, Cavelossim, in terminating the services of Shri Peter Fernandes, Gardener with effect from 16-10-2003, is legal and justified?

(2) If not, what relief the workman is entitled to?”

2. Notices were issued to both parties. The Party I filed his claim statement at Exb. 3. The Party II filed its written statement at Exb. 5. The rejoinder of the Party I is at Exb. 6.

3. The Party I was in service of the Party II as a Gardener from 28-10-2000 till the date of his termination i.e. till 16-10-2003. The Party I has stated that he was employed by the Party II to

carry out permanent nature of work. The Party I further stated that in order to deprive him permanency and the facilities of permanent workmen, the Party II engaged in unfair labour practice by giving artificial breaks and by forcing him to sign a contractual appointment. The Party I stated that he was assured by the Party II that his services would be regularized. However, instead of regularizing his services, the Party II terminated his services w.e.f. 16-10-2003. The Party I has stated that he had rendered continuous services of 240 days in the twelve months preceding his termination. The Party I has stated that the Party II has violated Section 25-F of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947. The Party I has stated that Party II had engaged more than 150 workmen despite which Party II did not seek permission from the appropriate government and has thereby violated provisions of Chapter V-B of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947. The Party I, therefore, claimed that his termination is illegal and unjustified and he has sought reinstatement in service with full back wages with continuity in service.

4. The Party II has stated that the appointment of Party II was for a fixed term period specified in the contractual agreement which was accepted by the Party I. The Party II has denied that the Party I was appointed on a regular post or that he was assured that he would be regularized. The Party II further stated that the termination of the Party I was on account of non-renewal of the contract of appointment and as such, the provisions of Sec. 25-F are not applicable. The Party II has further stated that the Party I is gainfully employed and that he is not entitled for any reliefs.

5. Based on the aforesaid pleadings, following issues were framed at Exb. 7:

ISSUES

1. Whether the Party I proves that the Party II terminated his services from 16-10-2003 in violation of the provisions of Sec. 25-F and Chapter V-B of the I. D. Act, 1947?
2. Whether the Party I proves that the action of the Party II in terminating his services with effect from 16-10-2003 is illegal and unjustified?
3. Whether the Party II proves that the dispute referred is not an industrial Dispute either under Sec. 2K or 2A of the I. D. Act, 1947 and hence the reference is not maintainable?

4. Whether the Party II proves that the Party I was appointed purely on contractual basis for a fix term period and the termination of his service was as per agreements which did not amount to "retrenchment"?
5. Whether the Workman/Party I is entitled to any relief?
6. What Award?

6. The matter was posted for evidence. However, during the pendency of the proceedings, the Party I as well as the Representative of the Party II remained present before the Tribunal on 2-6-2009 alongwith their Representative/Advocate and stated that they have settled the matter amicably. The parties have filed the consent terms at Exb. 11. These terms are duly signed by the parties and the said terms are acceptable to them. In my opinion, these terms are in the interest of the workman and hence these terms are taken on record and the Order is passed as under:-

ORDER

1. It is agreed between the parties that the management of M/s. Haathi Mahal, Mobor, Cavelossim, Salcete-Goa, shall pay in total a sum of Rs. 20,973/- (Rupees Twenty thousand nine hundred seventy three only) to Shri Peter Fernandes, by way of 2 installments:

(a) 1st installment of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) bearing cheque No. 12816 dated 1-4-2009 drawn on HDFC Bank, payable at par.

(b) 2nd installment of Rs. 10,973/- (Rupees Ten thousand nine hundred seventy three only) bearing cheque No. 12506 dated 20-4-2009 drawn on HDFC Bank payable at par.

2. The above amount of Rs. 20,973/- (Rupees Twenty thousand nine hundred seventy three only) shall include all his claims arising out of the present reference No. IT/49/2004 and his employment, including any claims of earned wages, bonus, gratuity, leave encashment, retrenchment compensation, ex-gratia etc., or any other claim which can be computed in terms of money.

3. It is agreed that Shri Peter Fernandes shall accept the said amount as mentioned in the clause (1) hereinabove in full and final settlement of all his claims arising out of the present reference and arising out of his employment including any claim of earned wages, bonus, gratuity, leave encashment, retrenchment compensation,

ex-gratia, etc. or any other claim which can be computed in terms of money, in complete satisfaction of all his claims including the claim made in the present reference No. IT/49/2004 and further confirm that he shall have no claim of whatsoever nature against the company including any claim of reinstatement and/or re-employment.

No order as to costs. Inform the Government accordingly.

AWARD

(Passed on this 18th day of March, 2009)

1. In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (d) of sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Industrial

Disputes Act, 1947 (Central Act 14 of 1947) the Government of Goa by order dated 11-2-92, bearing No. 28/65/91-LAB referred the following dispute for adjudication by this Tribunal.

1. "Whether the action of the Panaji Municipal Council, Panaji, in terminating the services of Shri Babun Beg, Scavenger, w.e.f. 31-1-1990, is legal and justified?
2. If not, to what relief the workman is entitled?"

2. On receipt of the reference, a case was registered under No. IT/21/92 and the registered A/D notice was issued to the parties. In pursuance to the said notice the parties put in their appearance. Adv. P. J. Kamat represented the Party I (for short, "Workman") and the Party II (for short, 'Employer') was represented by Adv. G. K. Sardessai. The workman filed a statement of claim at Exb. 7. The facts of the case in brief as pleaded by the workman are that he was employed as scavenger by the employer from 15-12-1970 and he worked honestly, diligently and without any adverse remarks. That on 22 March, 1989 the workman received a message from his native place that his mother was seriously ill and that his presence was necessary. That accordingly the workman proceeded to his native place on 22nd March, 1989 and he could not inform the office about his proceeding to his native place. That on 3-4-89 the workman returned from his native place and went to report for work on 4-4-89 along with the letter stating as to why he could not report for work earlier. That the inward clerk refused to accept the said letter and therefore he approached the Chief Officer of the employer who told him that he could not attend the duty until further orders. That since the workman was not allowed to report for work from 4-4-89 he had to remain at his residence without any work. That thereafter in the month of November, 1989 the workman was called by the employer and was allowed to work for about 2½ months. On 31-1-90, the workman was called in the employer's office through a messenger and was served with the order of termination of service dated 28-12-89. The workman contended that since he was not allowed to report for work from 4-4-89, it amounted to suspension from work without wages. The workman further contended that neither charge sheet nor notice of enquiry was served on him on his last known address as conveyed to the employer by him by his reply dated 11-7-86. The workman contended that the notice was deliberately published in the English Daily so as

to prevent him from getting the knowledge of the date of the enquiry. The workman also contended that the enquiry was conducted in gross violation of principles of natural justice and that the findings of the Inquiry Officer are not based on any evidence on record and the same are perverse. The workman contended that the action of the employer in terminating his services is illegal, arbitrary, vindictive and unjustified.

3. The employer filed the written statement, which is at Exb. 8. The employer stated that the workman was very irregular in attending to his duties and had developed the habit of remaining absent without leave on several occasions. The employer stated that from 23rd March, 1989, the workman remained absent till 31st March, 1989 and therefore a show cause notice dated 4-2-89 was issued to him and the workman refused to accept the same. The employer stated that the workman continued to remain absent without leave even thereafter and did not submit any intimation about his absence directly or through the Union and therefore a charge sheet dated 10-5-89 was sent to him at his last known address by Regd. A/D. The employer stated that the said charge sheet sent by Regd. Post was returned unserved with the postal remark that the addressee had left the place. The employer stated that the workman had not intimated about the change in his address. The employer therefore sent another letter containing the charge sheet dated 17-5-89 to the workman but the same was also returned unserved with similar remarks from the postal authorities. The employer stated that since the charge sheet dated 17-5-89 sent by post was returned unserved the same was published in the local newspapers namely the Navhind Times and Gomantak. That in the said charge sheet published in the newspapers the workman was informed about the date and place of enquiry, however he did not attend the enquiry on the date fixed and therefore the enquiry officer was forced to conduct the enquiry ex-parte. The employer stated that the report from the enquiry officer the same was placed before the Standing Committee and the Councilors, who reached the decision that the workman deserves the punishment of termination of service. The employer stated that permission from the Director of Municipal Administration was sought for the dismissal of the workman from service as required under the provisions of Municipalities Act and on obtaining the approval, the employer terminated the services of the workman by letter dated 28-12-89 w.e.f. 31-12-90.

4. The employer denied that the workman had proceeded to his native place on account of sickness of his mother. The employer contended that neither the workman nor the Union had brought to its notice that the mother of the workman was sick and that he was required to proceed to his native place. The employer denied that the workman was called by the Council to resume work or that he was not allowed to work from 4-4-89 as alleged by the workman. The employer stated that the workman was not suspended from any date or for any period and therefore the workman is not entitled to any subsistence allowance as alleged by him. The employer denied that the workman was not served with the charge sheet or the notice of enquiry. The employer stated that it is the workman refused to accept the charge sheet and the notice of enquiry. The employer denied that the enquiry was held by the Inquiry Officer in violation of the principles of natural justice. The employer denied that the termination of the services of the workman is illegal, arbitrary, vindictive or unjustified.

5. Based on the aforesaid pleadings, the following issues were framed:

1. Does Party I prove that the domestic enquiry held against him is not legal and proper?
2. Does Party I prove that the order of termination passed against him by Party II is not legal and proper?
3. If yes, whether Party I is entitled to any relief?
4. What Award or Order?

6. *Issue No. 1* was treated as Preliminary issues. Findings on these issues were given by order dated 17-1-97, wherein it was held that the inquiry held against the workman was not fair and proper. The parties were directed to adduce evidence on merits. Pursuant to the said order, the employer examined its witness, Shri Ubaldo Dias and has filed written argument at Exb. 8. The workman has neither adduced evidence nor advanced any argument. No arguments are advanced on behalf of the workman. I have perused the records and considered the arguments advanced by the employer and my findings are as under:

7. *Issue No. 2*: The workman was working for the Party II employer as a scavenger. The services of the workman were terminated w.e.f. 31-1-90 for unauthorized absence. It is the case of the employer that the workman had remained absent from 23rd March, 1989. In this regard, the witness,

Shri Ubaldo Luis, the superintendent of the employer has deposed that the workman had remained absent from 23-3-89. He has deposed that the workman remained absent till June, 1989. The evidence of this witness vis-a-vis the attendance register at Exb. E-4 proves that the workman had not reported for work from 23-3-89. It may be mentioned here though it was suggested to this witness that the attendance register is false and fabricated, the workman has not adduced any evidence to support the said contention evidence and as such the said attendance register cannot be discarded on the basis of such bare suggestion.

8. It is also pertinent to note that the workman had not denied having remained absent from duty from 23-3-89. The workman had averred in the claim statement that on or about 22-3-89, he had received a message from his native place that his mother was seriously ill. The workman had stated that he had to rush to his native place because of his mother's sickness. The workman has stated he could not inform the office before proceeding to his native place. The workman has stated that he had returned from his native place on 3-4-89 and on 4-4-89 he had gone to the office to report for duties. The workman has stated that he had also tried to give an application wherein he had sought to explain his absence. The workman has stated that the concerned clerk refused to accept the said application. Thereafter he went to the chief officer and explained to him the reason for his absence. The workman had stated that the Chief Officer had told him not to attend duties until further orders and had asked him to collect a letter dated 4-4-89 from the office. He has stated that the contents of the letter were not explained to him and his request to get the said letter explained from the Union was turned down.

9. The aforesaid pleadings clearly indicate that the workman was absent from 23-3-89 and that he had not informed the Party II that he would not be attending duties from 23-3-89. It is also the case of the workman that he was not allowed to explain his absence. It may be mentioned that though the workman has claimed that he had reported for work on 4-4-89 and that the employer did not allow him to resume duties, the workman has not stepped in the witness box and has not adduced any evidence to prove the case set up by him in his claim statement. The workman has therefore failed to prove that he had to proceed to his native place because of his mother's sickness and that he was not allowed to report to work from 4-4-89. In the absence of such evidence, the case set up by the workman cannot be accepted.

10. The evidence adduced by the Party II amply proves that the workman had remained absent from 23-3-89 onwards. The absence of the workman was unauthorized. It is true that the Party II has not specified the provisions of the Certified Standing Order/Service Rule under which the act of habitual absence amounts to misconduct, but from the arguments advanced before the Tribunal on issue No. 1, which are incorporated in order dated 17-1-97 at Exb. 14, it is clear that there is no dispute between both parties that Model Standing Orders govern the employees of the Municipal Council. Habitual absence without leave or absence without leave for more than 10 days is misconduct under clause 14(e) of Model Standing Orders. As stated earlier, in the instant case, the workman remained absent without leave from 23-3-89 until the date of initiating disciplinary action i.e. 17-5-89, which act constitutes misconduct under the Model Standing Orders. Hence, the change of unauthorized absence leave against the workman is proved to the satisfaction of this Tribunal.

11. Now coming to the quantum of punishment, it is well settled that the powers conferred on the Tribunal u/s 11 A of the Act have to be exercised judiciously having regard to the facts and circumstances of each case. In the instant case, the workman is guilty of prolonged unauthorized absence. As held by the Apex Court, in the case of L & T Komatsu Ltd., v/s N Udaykumar 2008 (1) SCC 224, habitual absenteeism is gross violation of discipline. In the instant case, the workman has neither justified his absence nor shown any extenuating circumstances to interfere with the penalty imposed by the Party II. Needless to state, every employee regardless of status or level has no show certain level of interest and devotion to duty. Staying away from duty without leave has to be viewed seriously as such; conduct adversely affects the office discipline and work ethos of the office. Such conduct therefore needs to be viewed seriously and this being the case the penalty imposed on the workman cannot be said to be shockingly disproportionate. Hence, the issue No. 2 is answered in the negative.

12. Issue No. 3: The workman is held to be guilty of gross misconduct and since the workman has failed to prove that the penalty imposed on him is illegal or unjustified, he is not entitled for any relief. Issue No. 3 is answered accordingly.

13. Under the circumstances, and in view of discussion supra, I pass the following order:

ORDER

1. The action of the Panaji Municipal Council, Panaji, in terminating the services of Shri Babun Beg, Scavenger, w.e.f. 31-1-1990, is legal and justified.
2. The workman is not entitled to any relief. Inform the Government accordingly.

(Passed on this 27th day of April, 2009)

1. By order dated 17-5-99, the Government of Goa, in exercise of powers conferred under Section

10(1)(d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (Central Act 14 of 1947) has referred the following dispute for adjudication by this Tribunal.

“(1) Whether the demand of the following workpersons, represented by the Goa Municipal Workers Union, for regularization in services from the date of completion of 240 days of continuous service, is legal and justified?”

- (9) Mr. Sajan Mulgaonkar.
- (10) Mr. Vithal Kundaikar.
- (11) Mr. Tilu Adconkar.

3. If not, to what relief the workmen are entitled ?”

2. Notices were issued to both parties. Pursuant to which the Party I hereafter referred to as workmen has filed their claim statement at Exb. 3. The Party II, hereafter referred to as the employer. The employer has filed its written statement at Exb. 7. The rejoinder of the workmen is at Exb. 8.

3. The workmen have claimed that they were employed by the employer in the year 1996. By letter dated 8-9-98, the workmen requested the employer to regularize their services. The employer did not respond to the said letter though the demand of the workmen was in conformity with the terms of settlement entered between the employees and the council. Hence, the workmen raised an industrial dispute. The workmen have stated that the employer terminated their services during the pendency of the conciliation proceedings. The workmen have claimed that they are entitled for regularization of their services.

4. The employer has denied that the workmen were employed in the year 1996. The employer has stated that these workmen were engaged for specific work i.e. for spraying Deltra Matrine and that they were relieved after the execution of the said work. The employer has stated that the settlement dated 10-10-96 relates to the employees who had completed 240 days of continuous service. The employer has stated that these workmen have not rendered continuous service of 240 days hence; they are not covered by the said settlement.

5. Based on the aforesaid pleadings, the following issues were framed:

1. Whether the statement of claim filed by the workmen/Party I is maintainable?
2. Whether the workmen/Party I proves that they have been employed with the Party II since the year 1996 and have completed 240 days of service?
3. Whether the workmen/Party I proves that their demand for regularization in service from the date of completion of 240 days of continuous service is legal and justified?
4. Whether the employer/Party II proves that the workmen/Party I were employed in October, 1997 for the purpose of executing the work of spraying Deltra Matrine and they were relieved once the said work was executed?
5. Whether workmen/Party I are entitled to any relief?
6. What Award?

6. The records indicate that the issue No. 1 was treated as a preliminary issue. The workmen have neither adduced evidence nor advanced arguments on the said issue. On the contrary, by application dated 2-3-09 at Exb. 28 and application dated 2-4-09 at Exb. 30, the workmen at Sr. Nos. 2, 5, 8, 9, 10 & 11 stated that their services are already regularized and that the dispute does not survive. These applications clearly indicate that the workmen at Sr. Nos. 2, 5, 8, 9, 10 & 11 are not interested in pursuing the dispute raised by them.

7. Be that as it may, by order dated 17-05-99 this Tribunal was called upon to adjudicate whether the workmen named in the reference were entitled for regularization of their services on completion of 240 days of continuous service. The dispute referred to this Tribunal involves the question of regularization. It need not be emphasized that the question of regularization can arise only when the workmen are in service. The pleadings in the claim statement as well as in the written statement indicate that the services of the workmen were terminated even before the order of reference. Since the services of the workmen were already terminated, the dispute that could be raised could be regarding the validity of termination and the relief which could be sought was of reinstatement. The workmen have not challenged their termination and have not sought reinstatement but have sought regularization of services, since the

workmen were not in service, their service cannot be ordered to be regularized. Consequently the claim/demand of the workmen is not maintainable. Hence the issue No. 1 is answered in the negative.

8. Under the circumstances, and in view of discussion supra, I pass the following order:

ORDER

The services of the workmen were terminated before the order of the reference. Hence, the claim/demand of the workmen for regularization of their services is not maintainable.

If the Government is satisfied that the said land is needed for the aforesaid purpose, a declaration to that effect under Section 6 of the said Act will be published in the Official Gazette and in two daily newspapers and public notice thereof shall be given in due course. If the acquisition is abandoned wholly or in part, the fact will also be notified in the same manner.
