In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 168 of the Goa Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 (Goa Act 4 of 2017) and sub-rule (3) of rule 45 of the Goa Goods and Services Tax Rules, 2017, the Commissioner, hereby extends the time period upto the 31st day of May, 2021, for furnishing the declaration in FORM GST ITC-04, in respect of goods dispatched to a job worker or received from a job worker, during the period from 1st January, 2021 to 31st March, 2021.

2. This notification shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from the 25th day of April, 2021.

In exercise of the powers conferred by the second proviso to sub-section (1) of Section 37 read with Section 168 of the Goa Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 (Goa Act 4 of 2017), the Commissioner, on the recommendations of the Council, hereby makes the

following amendment in the Government notification No. CCT/26-2/2018-19/64/1825, dated the 25th November, 2020, published in the Official Gazette, Extraordinary, Series II No. 35, dated the 26th November, 2020, namely:—

In the said notification, after the proviso, the following proviso shall be inserted, namely:—

“Provided further that the time limit for furnishing the details of outward supplies in FORM GSTR-1 of the said rules for the registered persons required to furnish return under sub-section (1) of Section 39 of the said Act, for the tax period April, 2021, shall be extended till the twenty-sixth day of the month succeeding the said tax period.”
